

Resolution of Support for the California Children's Outdoor Bill of Rights

Whereas, the California Polytechnic State University Recreation, Parks & Tourism Administration Department recognizes the significant concern about youth detachment from the outdoors, lack of physical exercise and the increased health risks associated with childhood obesity; and

Whereas, the California Polytechnic State University Recreation, Parks & Tourism Administration Department recognizes that unstructured play in the great outdoors can be a wonderful experience for people of all ages, and especially for our youth; and

Whereas, participating in outdoor activities is not only enjoyable, but also develops an appreciation of California's unique environment; and

Whereas, the California Roundtable on Recreation, Parks and Tourism, a volunteer consortium of public and private organizations has created the California Children's Outdoor Bill of Rights; and

Whereas, the Bill of Rights provides that youth between the ages of four and fourteen should have the opportunity to:

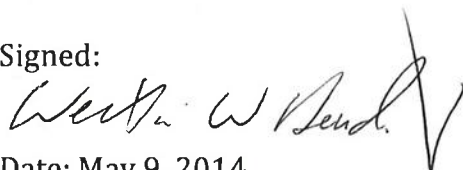
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| 1. Play in a safe place | 5. Follow a trail | 8. Go boating |
